We are often asked why no attempt is made to integrate deaf people into normal hearing society. Efforts in this direction are being made but they are rarely successful. The born deaf hardly succeed and the psychological effect of acquired deafness is in the majority of cases simply shattering. It very often destroys self-confidence, especially when found that hearing aids do not bring the hoped for relief. The consequent sense of frustration and deprivation makes life perplexing for the sufferer, relatives and friends who, because of the great difficulty in communication and the resulting misunderstandings, tend to avoid them. Hard of Hearing Clubs and Deaf Clubs enable these people to find new friendships and interests and help them to overcome their dilemma and embarrassment. The born deaf who tries to integrate into the hearing world finds eventually that he must have the companionship of his own people, and he always comes back.

Our Club is indeed a haven for them but, alas, our premises are woefully inadequate. We have to convert the existing building, make it more comfortable by installing central heating and by obtaining the necessary equipment.

Discussions and deliberations on this problem continued throughout the year and we finally reached the stage when we had to look for another meeting place for our deaf members. The Jewish Blind Society has kindly offered us facilities at their Day Centre for weekly gatherings during the period of re-building. The Victoria Boys' and Girls' Club has also come to our aid in providing office accommodation and we now look forward to the start of the necessary re-building work.

Educational Programme

During the past year we continued with our lecture and discussion evenings. We were fortunate to welcome among others Mr. C. C. Aronsfeld, the Director of the Wiener Library, Rabbi Dr. S. M. Lehrman, Mr. G. M. Moss of Moss Brothers, and Mr. Maurice Levinson, the Taxi-Driver and Author. Mr. A. Miller, the well-known Film Producer discussed with our very interested members the technique of film making and illustrated his talk with the extraordinary film: "Incident at Owl Creek"—a film in which not one word is spoken.

Entertainment, Sports and Games

Social contact with other Clubs was maintained and competitive games in chess, draughts, dominoes, billiards, snooker, table tennis, darts and other pastimes were again arranged. Badminton, so very popular with our more active members, was played throughout the year at Camden Baths, since there is no suitable Hall at our Centre.

Outings

We are particularly grateful to the Oxford Jewish Congregation for inviting a group of 70 deaf people to spend a Sunday as their guests at



one of the Colleges. Mr. George Silver the President, Councillor and Mrs. Meadows and Lord Segal of Oxford addressed them at the conclusion of a most memorable day.

Youth Section

The younger members continued with their particular programme arranged by their elected very enthusiastic Committee.

Religious Observances

We mentioned in previous reports that the various Voluntary Societies for the Deaf were founded principally to enable deaf people to take part in religious services. Great emphasis is placed by the Council of the Jewish Deaf Association on this aspect of our work. Every opportunity to observe—and participate in—the Jewish Festivals is given to members. Since the inception of the Association, communal Seder Services have been held on the premises, and Shavuot, Rosh Hashana, Succoth, Chanukka and Purim are all celebrated in the traditional manner, services being adapted to the Deaf's especial needs.

Welfare

Last year was an exceptionally busy one for our Welfare Officer. Apart from the many requests made to deal with problems of redundancy, unemployment, housing, sickness, recuperative holidays or interventions with authorities and firms, or interpreting at wedding ceremonies, hospitals and surgeries, deaf members unable to come to the Centre were visited at their homes, and help given when found necessary. Hearing Aids which are not available under the National Health Service Scheme were bought, at considerable cost, for specially deserving cases.

Visitors

Since the Club was opened many Jewish deaf people from this country and all over the world, very often spend part of their holidays with us. They know that a warm welcome awaits them whenever they decide to "drop in".

The "Over Sixties"

Our Old Age Pensioners and housewives love meeting at the Club on weekday afternoons for a friendly chat, refreshments and special entertainments which are arranged for them by the Chairman of the Friendship Club Committee, Mrs. T. Goldberg, and the Administrative Warden, Mrs. D. Margulies. During the summer months they are very often taken for the day to the seaside, and places of interest. A marked treat was provided for our old people at the home of Mr. and Mrs. George M. Gee.

Appreciations and Acknowledgments

We sincerely thank our Patrons, the Hon. Officers, Members of the Council, all the Ladies of the House Committee, the young people of the



Compton Committee, and the General Purposes Committee for all their hard work, their interest and time spent in furthering the aims of the Jewish Deaf Association. We feel deeply indebted to the Functions Committee, which under the Chairmanship of Mr. and Mrs. George M. Gee arranged a Dinner at the Painter's Hall to raise funds to enable the Association to meet its obligations for the current year.

Staff

We greatly appreciate the services of our loyal staff who never fail to serve the interests of the Association and our Deaf People.

The Invisible Handicap

We have received permission to publish extracts from two letters written to us by a Medical Practitioner:

"During my twenty years of medical practice, I have been closely associated with the problems which face the deaf of all age groups. I was much interested to learn only recently of your organisation and advice centre, and I would much appreciate an invitation to pay you a visit. I have personal reasons for my present interest."

"I was deeply moved by my experience on Wednesday evening last, when at your invitation, I mingled with the members of your Club.

First and foremost, by the happy, almost carefree, atmosphere which you spread about wherever you went . . .

Most of all, I acquired from the happy, animated faces of those who eagerly crowded to 'converse' with each other—and with you as you greeted them—a deep sense of humility in respect of my own disability and a sense of gratitude which will remain with me always. But my own experience is of infinitesimal importance in comparison with that of the Deaf Association which brings mutual happiness within the small world of the born deaf.

It remains for the whole world of those gifted with hearing and speech to surge into the afflicted small world and to extend in all manner of directions what is so essentially

God's work."

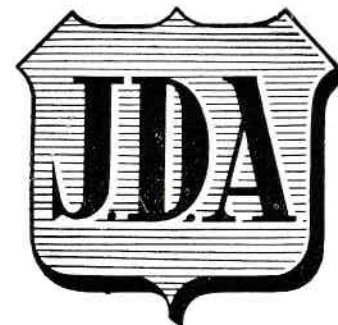
