## Annual Report, 1973-1974

The Executive Council and the House Committee are pleased to present the Annual Report for the year ended 31st March.

It has been a year when we have carefully looked to our future. Our inability to accept all those who would have liked admission to the Centre, because of our inability to place them in local schools, has led to the important decision to move the Centre to Woodford. Here we hope to be able to accept all those in need and offer help to Jewish deaf children already at the Woodford School. We believe that this move will enable us to carry out our function to the full for years to come.

In the meantime, life at the Centre has continued smoothly and happily. Full details will be found in the Director's Report. Once again we would wish to pay tribute to our exceptional staff — to the Senior Housemother, Miss Hares, whose single-minded devotion has contributed so much to the children's happiness, to Mrs. Richmond who, as Cook-Housemother, adds her invaluable contribution to the children's health and well-being, and to the two part-time assistants, Mrs. Anderson and Mr. Karczewski, for their kindly help. We wish to pay a special tribute to our most efficient, devoted and invaluable secretary, Miss May Mundy. Above all, we recognise how very much the happiness of the children and staff is due to the firm and friendly control of Mr. Denton, our Director.

Financially we have keenly appreciated the continued generous support of many friends, both organisations and individuals, as listed in later pages of this Report. But our very grateful thanks are due to our Hon. Treasurer, Mr. Julius Benjamin who, with keen vigilance and expert knowledge, has faced the heavy task of ensuring that the finances of the Centre could cope with the spiralling costs of maintenance and wages.

We are glad to report that, in spite of the heavy pressures of his communal work, the Rev. Reuben Turner has continued to respond unfailingly to our needs as Hon. Chaplain. We would wish to record too our appreciation to our Hon. Solicitor, Mr. Martin Philips, for his expert handling of all the legalities that are being and will be involved in our moving and re-organisation.

The year to come will be a momentous one in our history. It will see yet another change amongst the many we have experienced in the century and more since our small beginnings in 1865 in the East End of London. Every one of these changes has meant progress and expansion, and we shall hope that 1975 will see us once again looking forward to a widening of our field and the realisation of new plans to help the deaf children in all parts of our community. We are the only organisation in this country to whom parents of Jewish deaf children can turn to for specialised advice and help. To meet our wider task will inevitably enforce heavy expenditures in the coming year, and we plead for the fullest support of the community in the major fund-raising campaign that our Hon. Treasurer will initiate.

## DIRECTOR'S REPORT

As will be seen from the Report, steps are being taken to move to new premises in a situation where many more Jewish deaf children will be able to make use of all the facilities offered by the Centre, and I hope to report next year on the greatly increased numbers and activities in our new home.

A characteristic of the past year has been the increase in numbers of visits to the Centre by ex-pupils and other deaf children who are now at work. Many of these come with problems, seeking the advice and help of the staff here. The resident children are encouraged to invite their friends to the Centre when convenient, and many pupils of the local school for the deaf come to parties held here on various occasions.

Miss Keyser and Mrs. Carfrae, our visiting teachers of the deaf, attend regularly to give extra lip-reading and speech tuition to certain pupils, and make full use of the special auditory equipment donated by kind friends for this purpose.

Art and Handicraft lessons are always most popular with the pupils, and it is gratifying to be able to report that prizes in the Jewish Child's Day Art competitions have been won every year since the Centre opened. This year's winner was Mandy Trainis, but entries from many of our children were accepted for exhibition. As always, the pottery exhibits at our Annual General Meeting and Open Day in October were much admired and a very large attendance ensured a record sale.

All the High Holydays were duly observed, preceded by explanations in the classroom. The Festivals become more familiar and loved by the pupils as the years go by, and without doubt the most popular of all is Succoth which, being so colourful and visual, is specially easy for the deaf to appreciate. The Old Testament stories lend themselves exceptionally well to dramatisation, and we are all looking forward to having sufficient pupils in our new Centre to be able to produce once again the plays which were so popular at the old school.

Alex Olsen celebrated his Barmitzvah at the Centre on Sunday, March 24th, and our thanks are due to the Rev. Reuben Turner for conducting the specially adapted service. Alex is the second boy to be Barmitzvah at the Centre, and we expect to have many more such ceremonies in the new Centre as the young boys we now teach come of age.

Our grateful thanks are due to all our kind friends for enabling the children to enjoy many special treats, such as parties at Chanukah and Purim, fireworks night, birthday teas, film shows, etc., in addition to outings from time to time to London entertainments.

There have been no changes in the staff of the Centre during the past year, in itself a notable achievement these days, and I would like to add my grateful thanks to those already expressed by the President and the Chairman of the House Committee.
