# RESIDENTIAL CENTRE FOR JEWISH DEAF CHILDREN

## Annual Report, 1970-1971

The Executive Council and the House Committee are pleased to present the Annual Report for the year ended March 31st.

It has been a year of tranquil progress, the Centre being fortunate in the stability and quality of its staff, the rare incidence of any ill-health in the children, and the loyalty of the supporting friends in the community who have enabled us to continue our work with lessened financial stress.

There were some changes during the year in our two management Committees. The sudden death of Mrs. Elizabeth Tesler on the 24th February deprived the Executive Council of a member who had been associated with our work for almost the whole of her life, first whilst her aunt was headmistress of the old school in Nightingale Lane, then as secretary to the school from November 1958 to December 1962, after which she still retained her connection as a member of the House Committee and then of the Executive Council. Her warm-hearted interest and ever-ready help will be sorely missed.

In regard to the Hon. Officers, we were delighted at Mr. Sinclair's agreement to become our Vice-President, although this meant relinquishing the Hon. Treasurership in which his services had been outstanding over the last six years. As the new Hon. Treasurer, we welcomed Mr. Julius Benjamin, a keen and valued member of the Executive Council. We were also very pleased to welcome Mrs. David Sinclair (already an active member of the House Committee) on to the Council, and Mr. I. Spiro, our Hon. Ophthalmic Surgeon for many years, whose keen interest in the children and in our work generally, will prove a valuable asset to the Council.

During the year, the House Committee was depleted by the resignation of two members. Mrs. Lebor's resignation owing to pressure of work was received with much regret. Miss Ballinson, a member of the Committee since

her retirement in 1965 as Matron of the old School, has now finally retired to her home town of Cardiff, where we hope she will enjoy many happy years.

A detailed account of the day-to-day activities at the Centre will be found in the Director's Report. We would stress particularly the increasing attraction to the Centre of deaf children who, although living at home, look forward eagerly to spending one or more evenings a week at the Centre, to enjoy the companionship of our resident children in their handicraft and play periods. One non-resident boy is being prepared for his Barmitzvah in 1971—the first Barmitzvah at the Centre since it opened in 1965. We are subsidising at a kindergarten twin deaf girls, too young still to go to school, and have received happy reports of their progress in speech and lip reading. We have been instrumental in finding suitable social companionship for an older deaf girl whose parents were worried about this problem. These are but a few examples to stress the importance of our extra-mural work for non-resident Jewish deaf children outside the Centre in their widely-differing needs.

To the many friends (organisations and individual) who have continued to support us and enable us so to expand our work, we would offer our very grateful thanks. We would wish also to acknowledge yet once again our indebtedness to the loyalty and devotion of the staff—to Mr. Denton as its outstanding Director, to Miss Hares, the Senior Housemother, for her able administration and tireless care of the children, and to her two assistants, Miss McCrann and Mrs. El-Ami for their ever-willing co-operation. We would again like to express our gratitude to our secretary, Miss Mundy, for her most efficient and sympathetic help is invaluable to us all.

Finally, to the Rev. Reuben Turner as Hon. Chaplain, to Mr. I. Spiro as Hon. Ophthalmic Surgeon, and to Dr. D. B. Handley as Medical Officer (succeeding Dr. Goorney when he left last summer to settle in Israel) we offer our deep appreciation of their kindly and ever-ready help when needed.

## DIRECTOR'S REPORT

In this sixth year since the opening of the Centre, the number of fully resident pupils remained fairly constant, but there has been a significant increase in the number of children who, while not able to be fully resident, are nevertheless happy to attend for special activities, such as Religious Instruction, while sleeping at the Centre for one or two nights a week.

These activities and many others are pursued by the pupils as in previous years, with the addition this year of simple woodcraft, much appreciated by the growing boys. Miss Hares, our Senior House-mother, continues to maintain a high standard in the Art and Pottery section, the excellent work resulting in nearly all the pupils having entries exhibited in the Jewish Child's Day Art Exhibition 1970, Paul Davis and Corinne Greene also being awarded prizes.

All the Holydays and Festivals were observed in the traditional manner. Religious Instruction has never been considered merely a subject in the curriculum—its lessons permeate every activity carried on at the Centre, the more obvious results being seen in Art, Drama and Cookery. At all the Festivals, explanations are given to the pupils in terms they can fully understand, a facility unique to this Centre. The children are allowed to invite school friends to the parties held on these occasions, particularly at Chanukah and Purim, thus forging firmer ties of friendship and interest with their fellow pupils.

Preparations are in hand to hold the first Barmitzvah at the Centre, the boy, Barry David now attending regularly one evening a week for instruction. The Hon. Chaplain, the Rev. Reuben Turner, will perform the ceremony at the Centre on his return from Israel in September.

It is gratifying to be able to report that Paul Davis obtained a place at the Burwood Park Technical School for Deaf Boys, Sandra Israel a place at the Mary Hare Grammar School for the Deaf, and that Michael Van Oestren has passed the written examination for the Mary Hare Grammar School this year.

A very successful Annual General Meeting was held at the Centre in October, well attended by Committee members, parents, subscribers and friends. Great interest

was shown in the children's handiwork, and all the pottery for sale was eagerly snapped up. Prizes for the extra-curricular subjects were presented to the pupils by the President. Visitors on this occasion were able to visit our new Succah, attractively decorated by the pupils and staff.

It is always very pleasant to receive at the Centre visitors who are engaged similarly in communal activities, and this year we were privileged to welcome Councillor Mrs. Freedman who, with the President, spent an evening at the Centre showing a keen interest in all aspects of our work. Another visitor was Miss Maureen Kayser, studying at Teacher's Training College, who has since been kind enough to take some of our children to places of interest on certain weekends. We were also very glad to welcome Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Brass in February, whose particular interest was to see in use the Connevans Auditory Trainer which they presented to the Centre on the occasion of their Pearl wedding.

The pupils and staff are most grateful for all the gifts, both educational and recreational, presented to them by kind friends during the year, and which are listed elsewhere in the Report.

Many letters and telephone calls are received at the Centre, asking for advice on a wide variety of problems, mainly connected with Jewish deaf children but also on various other subjects. One such request was from a film producer asking for a lip-reader with knowledge of Hebrew, to help him to match a filmed report on a speech made by Golda Meir in Israel with the sound tape which proved to be out of synchronisation. Mrs. El-Ami, our Israeli House-mother, provided the Hebrew knowledge and I the lip-reading—to the producers' satisfaction!

In conclusion, I would like to say very sincerely that the smooth running of this Centre is, as always, due to the devotion, conscientiousness and untiring care given so willingly by the Senior Housemother, Miss Hares, ably assisted by Mrs. El-Ami and Miss McCrann.
